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Survey Terminology

In this survey, the words Complaint and Case are used, those terms are defined below:

Complaint: An allegation received by the Board of Nursing related to a specific licensee.

Case: A complaint that rises to the Board of Nursing threshold that a violation of the Nurse Practice Act may have occurred and merits investigation/collection of evidence.

The following terms are used throughout all surveys:

Board of Nursing: Jurisdiction's governmental agency responsible for the regulation of nursing practice. Includes any other terminology to refer to the regulatory authority (i.e. commission, examiners, registration, jurisdiction). When referring to board of nursing, the reference collectively includes Board Members, Executive Officer and Staff.

Jurisdiction: Refers to state, territory or district where a board of nursing is located. May also be used to refer generally to the board of nursing in a particular jurisdiction.


Board Staff: Staff of the board of nursing

Executive Officer: Person responsible for running the board of nursing. Includes any other terminology to refer to that authorized person (i.e. Executive Director)


Board Member: Member of the governing body of the board of nursing as outlined by statute

Practical nurse or PN: Licensed practical or vocational nurse (LPN/LVN)


Q1. Is child, elder, vulnerable adult abuse by a licensee required to be reported to law enforcement or another agency?




Q4. Who conducts investigations of complaints against licensees? (Check all that apply)




Q5. Does the Board of Nursing utilize any of the following practices? (Check all that apply)




Q8. Does the Board of Nursing have subpoena power during prosecution?





Q10. Are malpractice payment reports reviewed to determine if a disciplinary investigation is warranted?




Q11. Are malpractice payment reports stored/filed for future reference?









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


Q15. Who hears formal disciplinary proceedings? (Check all that apply)





Q18. Can the licensee be ordered to pay legal fees?



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


Q20. Is the Board of Nursing required to take disciplinary action in any of the following instances? (Check all that apply)



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Q22. Does the Board of Nursing offer an in-house non-disciplinary monitoring program for Substance Use Disorder?




Q23. Does the Board of Nursing refer the licensee to a contracted monitoring program for Substance Use Disorder?
